Craft Your Own Emergency Pre-Plans

Our FD3/CERT Program has been developed around the concept of preparing for a worst-case, Cascadia Subduction Earthquake that will devastate West Coast residents from British Columbia to Northern California. Our teams have developed operational "preplans" that have also been pre-approved so that CERT members are already authorized and able to mobilize and swing into action should they lack direct communications from their chains of command. That is only a partial solution however.

Every CERT member should also have a personal "pre-plan" that outlines the specific steps one should take in the event of a disaster event on the Olympic Peninsula. It will be too hard to think of everything on the fly when an emergency hits your home and family. In the midst of heavy damage or loss of infrastructure, it will already be too late to find and assemble all the essential supplies one might need to safely survive and recover from a catastrophic event.

The contents of your personal pre-plan will be specific to your own situation, but you can find extensive guidance at this link [https://www.ready.gov/plan] which, for brevity's sake, won't be replicated here. Once it is created, everyone in your family should be aware of your own pre-plan. Your plan should make allowances for variations in the kinds of emergencies you may encounter, whether they be earthquakes, fires, heavy snow, high winds, loss of electrical power, hazardous spills, or some combination of any of these hazards. Planning for the worst case does facilitate your responses to less serious events.

Over the course of the three-day festival, approximately 30 CERT members were present for duty. Traffic was heavy and parking was scarce. Warm days sometimes result in medical emergencies, and our CERTs supported the movement of emergency equipment into and out of the crowded park.

Fire Safety Trailer Demonstrations













Clallam County Fire District #3 recently received a gift from Fire District #4 in Joyce; it's a vintage training aid, a trailered Fire Safety mini-House. Built in the 1980's, this Fire Safety House is designed to simulate a fire situation in a home environment. It was equipped with the ability to simulate "hot" doors, blow theatrical smoke, and sound fire alarms. Its purpose is to orient children how to react to a fire in their house. The electronic control panels are currently in need of overhaul, but when the Safety House is fully restored, it will be regularly featured at Sequim's community events. CERT volunteers can be trained to "run" the fire simulations and thus contribute yet another community service to the Sequim Operational Area.



Hurricane Ridge Kennel Club Dog Show (July 26-28)









Each year, the <u>Hurricane Ridge Kennel Club</u> hosts a dog show that attracts hundreds of dog enthusiasts from all over the west coast and Canada. CERT helps park their vehicles safely.











CERT tasks include collecting day parking fees at the entrance and then assigning the vehicles to RV, FastCAT, Long, and General parking lanes. The 3-day show runs from 6:15 AM to about 2:00 PM for Friday, Saturday and Sunday. The Club provides CERT workers with a lunch.

CERT volunteers are greatly appreciated by the Show organizers. We also typically receive a lot of positive feedback from the Show participants as well. We practice CERT teamwork, radio skills, and public interactions. Sequim's Soroptimist International Club sponsors an annual Back to School Fair at the Boys and Girls Club. At the 6-hour event, students can receive free school supplies, COVID vaccinations, and a chance to inspect and touch CCFD3 fire equipment. CERT volunteers manage the traffic flow through the Club's busy parking lot, entrances and exits, mostly to keep the kids safe relative to the moving vehicles. Cones and barriers were put in place to guide one-way traffic through the access lanes.

DART Training for CERT Ground Support









On 7 September, Members from CERT 2, CERT 3 and CERT 14 received an aircraft safety briefing from Mr. Dave Woodcock, Vice Chairman of Clallam's Disaster Airlift Response Team (DART). This training is intended to prepare CERT members to support emergency airlift operations at Diamond Point, Sequim Valley and Blue Ribbon airfields. A week later, on 14 September, CERT members practiced their on site aircraft support skills at the Seguim Valley airfield. The training is intended to orient CERT support personnel to enable them to perform safe and effective services to light aircraft or helicopters in order to transfer delivered boxes of food to Sequim Food Bank personnel standing by at the airfield. These are the kinds of service contributions that CERT members may do during a widespread emergency situation.

SOA/CERT Quick Items





Sharing Responsibilities in a Complex CERT Program:

Our FD3/CERT Program has grown to a size that requires a more distributed array of responsible points of contact to handle the increased complexity of our support missions. In a recent letter to our CERT members, Senior Program Manager Blaine Zechenelly outlined some new organizational assignments. In brief, they are as follows:

- --John Viada will serve as the FD3/CERT Logistics Chief who will operate from the ECC and be responsible for communications, emergency administrative support and supply acquisitions.
- --Butch Zaharias will lead our FD3/CERT medical supply, storage and distribution efforts. Butch is also Division Chief for our nascent R Corner and Deer Park Divisions, operating from Station 32. He oversees the CERT Safety House and leads medical instruction at the CERT Academy.
- --Ernylee Chamlee is the new Chief of the Sequim Division, operating from Station 34. She will also be the webmaster for the CERT Website and will develop our CERT Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs).
- --John Anzalotti is now Deputy Chief of the Sequim Division, operating from the Sunland CONEX. He will also serve as a temporary Captain for Teams 4 and 7 until their new Captains are announced.
- --Charlie Meyer is Chief of Carlsborg Division, operating from Station 33. He oversees PIO matters, KSQM interview scheduling, grant writing, the CERT Newsletter, photography, and drone mission development.
- --Bob McCauley is Chief of Miller Peninsula Division, operating from Station 37 or the Wild Bird Sanctuary CONEX. He is working to establish our CERT Program as a non-profit, 501(c)3 entity.

Emergency Shelters Coming Available:

While shelter management is not a focus for our CERT mission, the emerging availability of emergency shelters in the Sequim Operational Area (SOA) is a matter of interest because such shelters offer a potential relocation option for the survivors we recover during a disaster event. The City of Sequim has agreed to oversee the establishment of emergency shelter facilities in the SOA. Local churches are the most survivable large structures in our area, so the FD3 emphasis has been to work with local churches to establish a robust shelter program. To date, the following churches have been identified as potential emergency shelter locations:

- -- Dungeness Valley Lutheran Church: 80 beds.
- -- Trinity United Methodist Church: 80 beds.
- --Sequim Community Church: 140 beds.
- --St Luke Episcopal Church: 40 beds.

The City of Sequim would like to build up to a 1000-bed capability, so more facilities still need to be identified as emergency shelters.

KSQM Radio Interviews:

CERT members represent a diverse and professionally interesting array of community volunteers. Our background stories, experiences and motivations regarding our CERT commitments would be of great interest to KSQM's audience. Radio host Jim Emett ("Papa Jim") is co-Captain of CERT 3, and would love to spend a few minutes on the air interviewing CERT members. Such interviews can promote our program and help others in our community to decide to join us. His interviews are conducted on the third Friday of each month, from noon to one. Call Charlie Meyer or Cindy Z to volunteer. Don't be shy. It's fun.



The CERT Training Page on the website is constantly being updated. We don't always let team members know when we have updated the information. Here is some information that has been added recently:

- Academy Courses have been updated
 - Disaster Psychology has been updated
- Communications Training. Situation cards are now available to help you to rehearse typical radio conversations. You can practice talking on the radio while remembering frequencies and position titles.
- DART Training. Dart is now asking that ALL CERTs be trained in DART. CERTs can be used to offload supplies
 from aircraft, but CERTs cannot help unless they are certified. DART's PowerPoint training has been added
 to the website for review, but you must go through the classroom and practical training before being
 "certified." More information will be coming from the DART class coordinator, Donna Stoffel.

Several Teams are asking professional psychologists to teach their teams about Disaster Psychology and how to deal with Post Incident Stress Disorder. We will be video recording one such presentation on November 2 and that video will also be posted on the CERT Training Page for follow-on team training.

The new 2025 Training Calendar will be out soon. We are looking to move training topics around so that if some of our members leave for the winter, they won't miss the same classes each year. Again, there will be 4 months that will be "Captain's Choice" for training. If the new calendar doesn't show the specific topics you want to train on, let your captain know so he/she can arrange for that training on those months. Also, remember there is a **Standard Operating Procedure** (SOP) for training. To remain consistent with CERT's training standards, any training not from the website Training Page, **MUST** be pre-approved. This includes the Captain's Choice" training sessions. The SOP is on the Training webpage right under the Training Calendar.

The Training Committee AND YOUR DIVISION CHIEF can arrange for help at your team's training sessions. Just let us know.

Team Training Officers: Your captains can always use help. They have a lot of responsibility. We encourage teams to appoint a training officer who can take that duty off their captain's shoulders. Another way to help, ask members of the team to do the training for a specific month. Squad Leaders should be able to help with SAR training. Your Medical Support Squad Leader should be able to lead medical training. Make training a "team effort."
